## **PREFACE**

This special issue contains revised and extended versions of papers presented at the 34th Annual IEEE Symposium on Logic in Computer Science (LICS 2019), held in Vancouver in June 2019, and at the 35th Annual IEEE Symposium on Logic in Computer Science (LICS 2020), held online in July 2020. A small number of papers from the proceedings were selected and their authors were invited to submit a full version of their paper to this special issue. Their topics span a range of topics typically represented at LICS: automata theory, category theory, logics, trace semantics, type theory, and verification.
